Lutheran Ministries of Mercy (LMM)

Strength through Partnership in Administration and Management

LMM was founded in 2013 with the goal of promoting sustainability, improvement, and innovation in the direct service operations of partner organizations. Initially created by a partnership of Filling Homes in Napoleon, Ohio and Luther Home of Mercy in Williston, Ohio, the group was then joined by Lutheran Social Services of Northwestern Ohio in 2015. Working together, administrative services are combined, shared, and designed to assist affiliated agencies in enhancing mission-driven community services by providing costeffective and efficient management expertise.

Each of the organizations maintains their independent status as well as the independent status of their Foundations. At the same time, the combined strength, expertise, and size of affiliated agencies positively affect each organization. Affiliates have the advantage of a wider breadth and depth of expertise, of learning from one another, and sharing best practices. They also benefit from a larger collective visibility and voice in advocacy, rate setting, and vendor contracts, as well as in policy development and organizational systems design.

Together, our organizations impacted more than 28,134 lives during 2022, serving both children and adults across 24 counties in Northwestern Ohio and Southeastern Michigan. In 2023, we will celebrate 10 years of working together for the needs of those in our care. Dedicated staff, volunteers, donors, and corporate leaders join us all year long in service to others. We hope you will enjoy reading about our ministries in the pages ahead and join us in service to others.



Jen joins 217 other clients who participate in one of our eight community-based day programs where they are creating connections and gaining confidence and other social and employment opportunities, all while engaging in activities they love!

hen Director of Business Office Services, Jean Witt, recently celebrated her 60th anniversary at Luther Home, we knew it was a moment worthy of the royal treatment. In 1962 when she began as a volunteer and then three months later as an Administrative Secretary for \$1.00 an hour, things were very different. Then, it was pencil and paper; now, it's keyboards and computers. Jean has always been eager to learn new technologies and adapt to new responsibilities—including roles in finance, payroll, benefits, and even as an Interim Executive Director.

Over the years, her love of our residents and the Lord have served her well. Jean's passion makes her one of the longest serving employees in our almost 100-year history. When we asked Jean about her dedication, she simply said with a bright smile, "It became a habit. Luther Home has given me far more joy than I could have ever wished for. icole, a full-time employee at a Wood County factory, is a client of the Lutheran Social Services' Shared Success Employer Resource Network (ERN). This program provides services to local and regional employers who join the Network as a benefit to their employees. Clients like Nicole can receive onsite and face-to-face coaching services with Shared Success Coaches when these clients are facing challenges and personal problems. Coaches act as confidants, and "friends" to provide sessions that help their clients maneuver through some of life's most pressing issues.

Nicole shared, "I began to tell [my coach] what was going on in my life and she listened! When I was all done, I remember crying with happiness because someone finally understood. She connected me to resources I didn't know existed to meet my basic needs. She became a shoulder to lean on as I navigated through work and life following the death of my son, my mother's illness and death from cancer, and my own needs too! Now I tell my co-workers to go see a coach—and they do!"

We are grateful for our ERN employers who trust our coaches to work with their employees and are pleased that more than 250 individuals are helped annually through this partnership program.

n our ministries, faithful and generous donors provide the resources needed to successfully care for the people we serve. One donor, Terry Bossert, donates monthly to our ministries—and giving is part of his life's mission. His generosity can be felt throughout northwest Ohio where he has worked, volunteered, and lived most of his adult life.

Following his first "retirement" after 25 years at Prudential, he served as a bus driver for Perrysburg City Schools and a courier for ProMedica. "Mr. B" has also volunteered for the Fire Service and served 40 years as a Sunday School teacher at Lutheran churches in Columbus, Chillicothe, and Perrysburg.

A proud 1957 graduate of the former Libbey High School, he loves seeing young people find success in their lives. The programs and services offered by our ministries align with his own giving strategies.

"When I was younger, my family needed assistance and I turned to Lutheran Social Services for that help," he said. "They were there for me, and I never forgot it. I live a very modest life, have raised my children to be caring adults, and now, if I can give just a little goodwill to others each month, it makes me happy, too."
